Provide a brief outline of your team's idea / solution. This section should include the following:

1. A clear explanation of the idea. Make sure it is clear to the reader what you are proposing – is it a new physical product, digital solution, program or service? Who will be using it, and how will it be used?
2. What impact do you anticipate your idea might have on the problem you hope to address? Be sure to make compelling and evidence-based linkages between your idea and its ability to positively impact the problem.
3. Explain why you believe your idea is technically feasible and financially sustainable. Consider what community partners might be engaged to better ensure that your idea / solution has its desired impact?
